History and Purpose

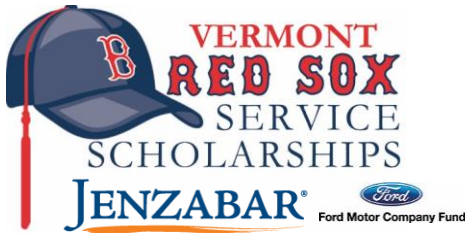
The Vermont Red Sox Service Scholarships is an honor awarded by the Red Sox Foundation, the official team charity of the Boston Red Sox. Through the Vermont Red Sox Service Scholarships program, the Red Sox Foundation will award a \$1,000 scholarship to **27 academically talented Vermont public high school seniors who have shown a commitment to community service**. This prestigious scholarship award is presented by **Jenzabar** and proudly sponsored by **Ford Motor Company Fund** for students pursuing a two-year or four-year degree at any college, university or trade school. In Spring 2018, the Vermont Red Sox Service Scholarships will be awarded to one student at each of the following 27 schools:

Criteria

These awards will honor 27 Vermont public high school seniors at the selected schools, who will be selected by the Red Sox Foundation according to the following criteria:

1. Each recipient must be a legal resident of Vermont and must plan to attend a two or four-year degree program at an accredited college, university or trade school and must be a graduating senior from one of the 27 selected public high schools in Vermont. Applicants must be planning to enter their first year of college or post-secondary education in the Fall of 2018.
2. Vermont Red Sox Service Scholarships award recipients will be chosen by the Scholarship Committee of the Red Sox Foundation. Recipients will be chosen from applications submitted by eligible students based on the following criteria:
 - **Academic performance**
 - **Demonstrated community service**
 - **Eligibility for financial aid**



Terms of Award

The Red Sox Foundation requires that all students comply with the terms of the award offered at the time of their acceptance of this scholarship.

Deadline

Applications must be submitted in one email by **Friday, February 16, 2018 at 5:00pm EST** to nescholarship@redsox.com.

1. Complete the enclosed application, making sure to include the following supplemental materials:
 - Student Aid Report (SAR)
 - Official High School Transcript
 - Written Essay
 - Letter of Recommendation
2. Please note that incomplete applications will not be reviewed.
3. **Please make sure each page is labeled with your school name, last name and page number.**
4. If possible, we kindly ask that all applications and supplemental materials are scanned as **one** document and emailed to nescholarship@redsox.com. **NO Google Docs, please.** **Please label the document with your high school and name:**

THE FOLLOWING POLICY APPLIES TO THE VERMONT RED SOX SERVICE SCHOLARSHIPS PROGRAM. PLEASE READ THIS CAREFULLY AND SAVE IT FOR FUTURE REFERENCE.

Scholarship grants will be made directly to the awardee’s qualifying college once the scholar is accepted and enrolled. Under no circumstances will grant funds be distributed directly to the scholar, family member, relative, trustee, guardian or any other individual. No cash payments will be made to any entity other than the college where the student is enrolled. Funds may be used for the scholar’s tuition, room, board or other college fees. Funds are not transferable to other students, programs or schools.
